The BC Summer and BC Winter Games are a stepping stone towards competing for Team BC. At the 2015 Canada Winter Games, 141 BC Games alumni were part of Team BC representing 57% of the athletes. Of the 88 medals earned, BC Games alumni won (or contributed to) 54 or 61% of Team BC's medals.
